Location

Select a location with at least 8 hours of direct sunlight everyday. Shadowed location will make it impossible to charge battery (1 pc 1.2V AAA NI-MH 400mAh battery) fully and will reduce the lighting time at night. Location **should not be** near a night time light such as porch lights or streetlights.

Operation

End users need to insert the solar battery with light string inside the lantern for first use.

The light can be turned on and off by using the ON/OFF switch, which is located under the solar panel:

ON: Turn light "ON" at dusk.

OFF: For shipping, storage and non-use, turn "**OFF**".

Troubleshooting

If your solar lamp does not work at night, it could be one of these following conditions:

- 1. Switch is at the OFF position, Make sure the battery is inserted correctly.
- 2. Battery is not fully charged.
 - a) Make sure the light is located in an area where the solar panel gets the maximum amount of sunlight everyday.
 - b) If the weather is cloudy or overcast during the day, the battery will not be recharged fully to operate properly at night. The solar panel must receive direct sunlight everyday to fully charge the battery. If the solar light does not receive enough sunlight during the day, it will be recharged during the next sunny day and resume normal operations

Note

- a.) Light will turn on automatically when dark, and turn off automatically at daytime for recharging.
- b.)Before first use, please charge for at least 8 hours.
- c.)Light will be on for about 7-8 hours at dark after battery is fully charged.



CAUTION: TO AVOID BATTERY LEAKAGE

- Be sure to insert the battery correctly and always follow the battery manufacturers' instructions;
- Do not mix old and new battery or alkaline, standard(carbon-zinc) or rechargeable batteries;
- · Always removes weak or dead batteries from the product.
