## Dimensions

68CM TALL (INC GROUND STAKE)

- **PRETTY FLOWERING TREE STAKES WITH 20 FLOWERS ON EACH (LEDs not replaceable)**
- **SOLAR POWERED WITH MULTICOLOURED LED'S THAT ILLUMINATE IN EACH OF THE FLOWERS AT NIGHT TIME**
- **AUTOMATICALLY TURNS ON AT DUSK**
- **SCATTER THEM AROUND FLOWER BEDS, PATHWAYS OR ANYWHERE WHERE YOU WANT A TOUCH OF COLOURFUL SPARKLE IN YOUR GARDEN**

**Battery:** 1x AA 1.2v 600Mah, Ni-MH

## ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS / INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE:

Unpack the components carefully. Please check all parts have been removed from the packaging.

To easily insert stakes into the ground, it is recommended to wet the ground first. To avoid damaging garden stakes when inserting into the ground, select a spot in soft, rock-free soil. Insert the base of the stake first then gently insert the rest of the stake into the base. DO NOT push directly against the solar cell or the ornament housing containing the actual LED light.

### Find an ideal Place for the Solar Light.

Place the solar light in an area where it will receive direct sunlight for at least 8 hours per day. The number of hours the light will illuminate is directly proportional to the hours of sunlight it receives. If the light is placed in a shaded area, it will not be able to fully charge and its illumination time will be limited. Do not place the light near other outdoor lighting like porch or streetlights. These may fool the sensor and keep the light from coming on, or cause it to turn off automatically

**BEFORE FIRST USE:** Remove the protective film from the solar panel.

### CHARGING AND OPERATION:

Set switch (located on the back of solar case) to **"ON"** position. Charge the solar product by placing it under direct sunlight for at least 8 hours.

The light will work automatically. It will charge under direct sunlight during the day time and illuminate at night.

**NOTE:** In order to test the lights simply cover the solar panel with your hand and **the** light should turn on

## Battery replacement

1. If solar product does not light up after it has been used for around 8 – 12 months, replace the rechargeable battery as it may be weak or worn out. (Battery 1x AA 1.2v 600Mah, Ni-MH, Rechargeable– Same equivalent type as recommended must be used).
2. **Battery replacement:**  
 Step1: Unscrew the battery compartment cover by using a Phillips head screwdriver (not included).  
 Step2: Remove the exhausted battery and install 1x new AA rechargeable battery according to the +/- polarity as beside image. Open the compartment carefully and ensure that wire inside the battery terminals is not damaged.  
 Step3: Replace battery compartment cover, screw it back into position and make sure is properly sealed.

## Care and Maintenance Recommendations

1. Clean solar panel with a soft sponge every couple of weeks.
2. Make sure all connectors are still tight and no water getting in.
3. During the winter if you can bring it inside and give a good clean ready for next year.


## BATTERIES

- Keep batteries away from children and pets.
- Do not mix used and new batteries.
- Remove the batteries if left for long periods.
- Never dispose of batteries in a fire.
- Battery disposal, spent or expired batteries must be properly disposed of and recycled in compliance with local regulations. For detailed information, contact your local authority.
- Follow the battery manufacturer’s safety, usage, and disposal instructions.
