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#### **GETTING STARTED**

#### Installation

- Unpack all parts and remove protective material.
- Do not connect the unit to the mains before checking the main voltage and before all other connections have been made.
- Do not cover any vents and make sure that there is a space of several centimeters around the unit for ventilation.

# **CONNECTION - AC/DC Adaptor**

- Insert the DC plug to the DC in jack of the main unit, then connect the AC/DC adaptor to AC outlet.
- 2. When you first plug the unit into the mains, the unit will go into standby mode. The Standby LED will light up
- 3. Turn on the unit by pressing "On/Standby" button. If the LCD display is on with backlighting, it means the power supply is normal. Now the system is ready to play music.

#### **BASIC OPERATIONS**

### Power ON / OFF

Press "POWER / FUNCTION" button to enter the working mode.

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Press and hold "POWER / FUNCTION" button to turn off the unit in standby mode.

## **Selecting Modes**

Press the "POWER / FUNCTION" button on the unit or the "FUNC." button on the remote repeatedly to switch between modes.

## **Adjusting Volume**

Rotate the "VOL" knob on the unit or press "VOL -/+" buttons on the remote to decrease / increase the volume.

Total 40 level volume and it displays MIN – MAX.

#### **ERP** power management

If the POWER button is not pressed and held to turn OFF the unit after it has stopped playing, the unit will power off automatically after around 10 minutes. Press "POWER / FUNCTION" button on the unit or the "O" button on the remote to wake the device up from standby mode.

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#### **FM OPERATION**

- 1. Turn on the system and set the volume to a low level. Press "FUNCTION" button to enter into FM mode.
- Connect the FM/DAB antenna onto the FM socket at the back of the unit, press the "SCAN" button to search the next available station. Or press and hold the "▶\" or "\" button for 4-5 seconds to start searching.
- 3. If you tune to a weaker FM station, the reception will automatically switch to mono.
  - You may press "SCROLL/ENTER" on unit or "ENTER" on remote control to change Stereo or Mono mode.
- 4. During FM working mode, press "INFO" button to see the following information on the screen: Auto(stereo/mono), Radio Text, Program Type, Signal Strength, Time/Date and Frequency.

When 'Strong stations only' shown on the display, the FM search only stops on strong stations.

#### **DAB OPERATION**

- 1. Connect the FM / DAB antenna at the back of the unit.
- 2. Turn the system 'on' and set the volume to a low level. Press "FUNCTION" button to enter into DAB mode.
- 3. The unit will scan the DAB station automatically until DAB stations are received, it stores all received DAB stations in the preset memory automatically. Once the auto-scan has been completed, rotate the "SCROLL" knob on the unit or the "TUNER -" or "TUNER +" button on the remote control to choose the DAB stations. If you tune into a DAB stereo station, 'stereo' will show on the screen.
- 4. During DAB playing mode, press "INFO" button on the main unit to see the information of the DAB station played on the screen, i.e. Program Type, Ensemble Information, Transponder, Audio Bit-Rate, Signal-Strength, Time/Date, DLS Information.

#### DAB MANUAL TUNING

- 1. Turn the system 'on' and press "FUNCTION" button to enter into DAB mode.
- 2. Press and hold the "SCROLL/ENTER" button, 'Manual tune' will show on the

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display.

3. Turn the "SCROLL" knob on the main unit or the "TUNER -" or "TUNER +" button on the remote control to select the transponder, then press the "ENTER" button to confirm station to listen to.

# **MEMORY FUNCTION IN DAB/FM MODE**


- 1. In DAB/FM playing mode, choose the desired radio station. Press and hold "PRESET" button for 2 seconds, "Empty P1" will flash on the display. Then, press "▶I" or "◄" button to choose the desired preset station.
- 2. Press "PRESET" button again to confirm and 'Preset 1 Stored' will show on the display.
- 3. Repeat the above 1 2 steps to program 20 desired DAB stations or 20 FM stations.
- 4. Press "PRESET" button one time to recall the stored stations. Then, press "▶\" or "\\" button to choose the stored station and then press "PRESET" button to confirm.


# **CD - MP3 / USB OPERATION**

### **COMPACT DISC CARE**

To remove a disc from its storage case, press down on the centre of the case and lift the disc out, holding it carefully by the edges.

Fingerprints and dust should be carefully wiped off the discs recorded surface with a soft cloth. Unlike conventional records, compact discs have no grooves to collect dust and microscopic debris, so gently wiping with a soft cloth should remove most particles. Wipe in a straight line from the inside to the outside of the disc.





Instructions for Use

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**Note:** CD or USB mode have the same operating procedures.

## **Playing CD or USB**

- 1. Press the "Power" button at the front panel and set the volume to a low level.
- 2. Press the "FUNCTION" button to enter the CD or USB mode.
- 3. CD: Press CD door "OPEN" button to open the CD door. Place a CD with the printed side facing up inside the tray, then close the CD door. The first track will start playback.
  - USB: Carefully insert USB drive in the USB socket. The first track will start to play back.
- 4. Press "PLAY/PAUSE" button to pause the playback. The track time will start blinking. Press "PLAY/PAUSE" button again to resume the playback.
- 5. Press "STOP" to stop the playback.

# TRACK SKIP AND HIGH SPEED TRACK SEARCH IN CD / USB MODE

- 1. During CD/USB playback, press "▶\" (Tracks Forward) button repeatedly to skip to following tracks. When press "◄\" (Tracks Backwards) button one time, the unit will return to the beginning of the track. Press "◄\" (Tracks Backwards) button again for the previous track.
- 2. To rapidly search forward or backward within a track and locate a specific passage of it, press and hold "▶N" or "I◀" button. The player will search forward or backward at high speed. Release the button when you hear your desired passage and the playback will resume normal from that point.
- 3. To select next folder (Album), turn the "SCROLL" knob on unit or press the "FOLDER" button on the remote control to select the desired folder and start playback from the desired folder.

Instructions for Use

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# **REPEAT and RANDOM Function**

Press the "PLAY-MODE" button on the unit or the "P-MODE" button on the remote control to choose the Repeat-Mode:

Rep1: plays the current playing track

RepF: plays the current playing folder (only by MP3-CD or USB)

RepA: plays the complete CD or USB

Rand: Random Play-Mode

NOTE: There is no folder in the disc if no MP3 is detected. When playing a CD-Disc, there has no ALBUM repeating function

#### MEMORY FUNCTION IN CD/MP3 MODE

- 1. In stop mode, press "MEMORY" to enter PROGRAM mode, "MEM" "P01 T 01" will show on the screen.
- 2. Press the "▶I" or "I◄" button to select your desired track and then press the "MEMORY" button to confirm.
- 3. Repeat step 1 and step 2 to continue to program.
  - Note: You can save a total of 20 MP3 tracks and 20 CD tracks. 'FULL' will show on the screen once over 20 MP3 tracks or 20 CD tracks are saved.
- 4. Press the PLAY/PAUSE button to play the saved tracks, press "▶I" or "I◄" button to select a track in the sequence saved.
- 5. Press the "STOP" button twice to leave program mode. The entire program stored in memory is canceled.

#### **BT FUNCTION**

- 1. Turn on the unit and press the "FUNCTION" button to select BT mode.
- 2. The LCD display will show [BT disconnected] and flashing.
- 3. Select from your portable device (Smartphone, Tablet) the ID *BT* tagged as 'L790', then confirm connection.
- 4. Once the connection is finished and the equipment successfully paired, the LCD display will show [BT connected].

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5. Now you can stream the music to the unit and enjoy the music through the speakers of this device. Adjust the Volume to a safe level.

#### **TURNTABLE OPERATION**

#### **IMPROTANT**

Phono and Aux are sharing the same function band. Once the 3.5mm Aux-in jack is being connected, unit will switch to Aux-in function automatically. Therefore, make sure the 3.5mm Aux-in jack is not being connected if you wish to play a record.

# **PLAYING RECORDS**

This system includes a full-size, 3-speed, belt-drive turntable. You can play  $33^{1}/_{3}$  / 45 / 78 rpm records.

Carttridge

- 1. Press the "FUNCTION" button to enter the "PHONO/AUX" MODE.
- Make sure that you have removed the stylus cover from the stylus and have released the tone arm lock that secured the tone arm to the tone arm rest.
- 3. Set the turntable speed selector to the appropriate speed 33<sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> or 45 or 78 rpm. If you are playing 45 rpm 'singles', place the 45 rpm adapter on the centre spindle.
- 4. Place your record on the centre spindle.
- 5. Raise the cue lever to lift the tone arm off its rest. Move the tone arm to the edge of the record. The turntable starts automatically. Use the cue lever to gently lower the tone arm onto the record.
- 6. Press the "VOLUME -/+" button to the desired level.
- 7. When the tone arm reaches the end of the record it automatically returns to the tone arm rest and the record player stops.

**NOTE:** Do not turn or stop the turntable manually. Moving or jarring the turntable without securing the tone arm clamp could result in damage to the tone arm.



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### LISTENING TO TAPE

## **General operation**

Cassette playback: Turn on the unit and set to Phono/AUX

function. Insert the tape following the direction of the below figure. The system will start the playback automatically after

inserting of cassette tape

Stop and eject: Press the "Tape forward / Eject " button

completely inwards and the cassette tape will be ejected though the cassette door cover. The "tape forward / eject "button

will stay at lowest height position.

Fast forward: Press the "tape forward / Eject " button


half inwards during Playback mode, the tape winding forward direction. The "tape forward / eject" button will stay at middle

height position.

Slightly press the "Tape forward / Eject

"button again to resume normal playback. The "tape forward / eject" button will

resume to the highest position.









#### Remark

- Make sure the direction is correct when inserting the tape into the system.

Instructions for Use

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- Some searching noise can be heard and the system cannot perform normal playback function during fast forward mode.
- It is recommended to remove the cassette tape from the system every times after listening and not to leave the cassette tape inside the system when not under playback mode.

#### **USB RECORDING**

# 1. CD/MP3 RECORDING

# Recording one track:

- 1. Plug USB drive into USB socket.
- 2. When playing the desired CD/MP3 track, press the "RECORD" button once, "Check" then "REC USB" will show on the display.
- 3. Press "RECORD" button again which will show "REC One". Then press the "RECORD" button to confirm to record the playing track.

# Recording all tracks in a disc:

- 1. Plug USB drive into USB socket.
- 2. During the CD/MP3 stop mode, press the "RECORD" button once, "Check" then "REC USB" will show on the display.
- 3. Press "RECORD" button again which show "REC All". Then press the "RECORD" button to confirm to record all tracks.

#### 2. BT RECORDING

- 1. Plug USB drive into USB socket.
- 2. During the BT playing mode, press the "RECORD" button once and the display will show "Check" then "REC USB". "USB" is flashing.
- 3. Press "RECORD" button again to confirm. "REC USB" is flashing in the display and the unit starts recording.

#### 3. AUX IN RECORDING

1. Plug USB drive into USB socket.

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- 2. During the AUX-IN playing mode, press the "RECORD" button once and the display will show "Check" then "REC USB". "USB" is flashing.
- 3. Press "RECORD" button again to confirm. "REC USB" is flashing in the display and the unit starts recording.

# 4. DAB/FM RECORDING

- 1. Plug USB drive into USB socket.
- 2. During the DAB/FM playing mode, press the "RECORD" button once and the display will show "Check" then "REC USB". "USB" is flashing.
- 3. Press "RECORD" button again to confirm to choose record the playing DAB/FM station. "REC USB" is flashing in the display and the unit starts recording.

## **NOTE:**

- Press "STOP" button to stop the record function during recording mode.
- Press "INFO" button of the remote control under Bluetooth/Aux recording, to select the recording bit rate from 32 − 256KHz. Press "" or "" button to choose the desired bit rate and press "INFO" button again to confirm.
- The bit rate of Bluetooth/Aux-in/DAB/FM/ recording is preset at 128KHz.
- The recording bit rate for CD/MP3 recording cannot be changed.
- After recording, the USB will generate different folders to store the recorded tracks:

FROM CD: to store the tracks recorded from MP3 disc

RIP: to store the tracks recorded from CD disc

RED: to store the tracks recorded from BLUETOOTH / AUX-IN / DAB / FM

# **DELETE USB RECORDING (BY REMOTE CONTROL)**

### <u>Delete one Track:</u>

1. During the USB stop mode, press the "DELETE" button on the remote control once, 'DEL-T001' will show on the display.

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- 2. Press "" or "" button to choose the file to delete.
- 3. Press "DELETE" button again and the display will show "Yes" and flashing "No", press "▶■" to choose "Yes"
- 4. Press "DELETE" button again to confirm.

### Delete all Tracks:

- 1. During the USB stop mode, press and hold the "DELETE" button for few seconds on the remote control, 'DEL-A' will show on the display
- 2. Press "DELETE" button again and the display will show "Yes" and flashing "No", press "▶1" to choose "Yes".
- 3. Press "DELETE" button again to confirm. All files in the USB will be deleted.

#### **AUX IN OPERATION**

Press "FUNCTION" button to select the AUX mode. Insert the audio cable (not included) into the matching 'AUX IN' socket of the unit.

Start the playback of the connected device and you can hear the sound in the unit.

### **MUTE / EQ OPERATION**

During playing mode, press "MUTE" button on the remote control once, the sound will not be heard from the speakers and 'MUTE' will show on the display; press "MUTE" button or "VOL +/-" or "EQ" button to cancel mute function and the sound can be heard again from the speakers.

During playing mode, press "EQ" button to choose the different sound effect from "POP/ CLASSIC /ROCK/ JAZZ / FLAT", you can choose the desired one.

Note: To leave the "EQ" mode, press and choose 'FLAT'.

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#### **PHONES OPERATION**



During usual operation insert the earphone's cable (not included) into the matching 'PHONES' socket of the unit. Now you can hear the sound exported to your earphones.

**Note:** Set the volume lever lower during the PHONES operation.

To prevent possible hearing damage, do not listen at high volume levels for long periods.

#### **SETTINGS**

#### LANGUAGE SETTING

During FM or DAB playing mode, press "MENU" button and then rotate the "SCROLL" knob Backward or Forward to choose 'Language' and press "SCROLL" knob to confirm enter into "LANGUAGE" setting. You can choose from "English – German". Press the "SCROLL" Knob again to choose your desired language.

## TIME AND DATE

- 1. Set the unit to Standby mode
- 2. Press and hold the "MENU" button on the remote control or "MENU/PLAY-PAUSE" button on the unit, "24 HR" is flashing in the display.
- 3. Set the "12 HR" or "24 HR" mode by pressing "INFO/▶I" or "◄/SCAN" button. To confirm press the "MENU" button, the hour begin flashing.
- 4. Set the hour by pressing the "INFO/►N" or "I◀/SCAN" button. To confirm press the "MENU" button, the minutes begin flashing.
- 5. Set the minutes by pressing the "INFO/▶\" or "◄ /SCAN" button. To confirm press the "MENU" button again and the time setting is finished.

#### **FACTORY RESET**

In DAB mode, press and hold the "INFO" button on the unit, "Press Select Key to Reset" will show in the display. Press the "SCROLL/ENTER" button to confirm. "System Reset" will show in the display which means the factory reset is successful.
